What in the world have we been doing at Aldersgate? The answer is: A LOT.

- We have met our financial commitment to the Datwylers in Ecuador, the Drumms in Southeast Asia, and Kathryn Parker in Nepal. So far, this year, we have distributed \$650.00 to each.
- Our Friday Night Light gatherings have collected \$4,768.00 to be distributed to several local agencies and even some beyond Chico.

A mission interest group met to clarify our focus for the remainder of this year.

- First off, the Drumm family notified us that they are no longer over seas in the mission field. Their need is not as needed now that they are stateside.
- We will replace the Drumm family with the Healthbridge Ministry.
- Kathryn Parker will be at Aldersgate on Sunday, October 8 at 6:00 p.m. She will speak after an old fashion church potluck. Bring a dish to share and your own utensils. Drinks will be provided.
- Another way to help is to support the Salvation Army by providing something concrete to their ministry each month. September will be peanut butter month. There will be a container at the entrance of the church for this purpose.

Trustee's report

The following are items of interest:

- The mulberry tree, in the front lawn, and the walnut and oaks near the back fence are scheduled to be pruned in the next two week by Complete Tree Care.
- Lifeline Screening will be here September 26. We will need help tearing down the sanctuary after the service on the 24th and then again after they leave to reset the sanctuary for the following Sunday.
- There will be a Fall workday on October 14. We would appreciate having all hands on board for a successful workday.
- When McClelland did their semiannual servicing of the HVAC system, they found that one of the air conditioners, for the sanctuary, was not working and they gave us a quote to replace it. Because we are not in a financial position to replace it, Chris Gardener was able to get another estimate that allowed us to repair the unit. Because the unit was old, it took most of the summer to find the parts to do the repair. There is no indication how long this repair can last.
- This brought up the need to include, in future budgets, an amount to be set aside each year for capitol maintenance. This is so that the trustees have funds to replace major cost items. Think of .things like the afore-mentioned AC unit, painting of the church, roof replacement, parking lot maintenance, kitchen appliances, all the things that must be taken care of to keep the church property in the condition that we like to have it.
