Holy Week is March 23-31st this year. Here are how the days break down:



Sunday March 23rd is Palm/Passion Sunday. This is the day that Jesus came into Jerusalem and was received like a

King. Please read Matthew 21:12-22, Mark 11:15-19, Luke 19:45-48, and John 2:13-17

Monday is the day that Jesus turned over the change tables and cleared the Temple Please use the same passages from Sunday.

Tuesday several things happened, Jesus taught in the Temple, He went to the Mount of Olives and gave what is known as the Olivet Discourse, and this is the day that Judas agreed to betray Jesus. Please read Matthew 21:23-24:51, Mark 11:20-13:37, Luke 20:1-21:36, and John 12:20-38.

Wednesday was probably a day of rest for Jesus after two long and grueling days. We are not told of what happened on Wednesday in Scripture. Maybe divide Tuesday's reading up and do two on Tuesday and two on Wednesday, they are long passages.



Thursday is where things start to get somber. We call his day **Maundy Thursday**, and this is where Jesus has his last meal

with his disciples and has the Last Supper. After the Supper Jesus goes to the Mount of Olives and prays. Please read Matthew 26:17-75, Mark 14:12-72, Luke 22:7-62, and John 13:1-38.



Friday, March 29, is a very busy day for Jesus. He had his six, yes six trials, was crucified, died, and was buried. We call this Good Friday.

Please read Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 22:63-23:56, and John 18:28-19:37

I hope you have a Blessed Lenten Season, and remember I recommend that you give up some time to open up your Scriptures and read about the last week of Jesus' life. You can find that in each of the Gospels here:

Matthew - Chapters 26-27 Mark - Chapters 14-15 Luke - Chapters 21-23 John - Chapters 13-19

I will also have a handout that shows you a whole outline showing you where you can find each event in each Gospel. I pray it will be a blessing for you to look at, study, and read during the month of March!

On Saturday June 1, & Sunday, June 2 we're holding Aldersgate's 65th anniversary. We're forming a team who will brainstorm ideas then make a plan for that weekend. What are your ideas? You won't have to be the hands & feet that weekend (unless you want to be). Right now, we need our ideas & voice. It's just 3 months away!!! Yikes. Please let pastor Scott &/or I know if you will help plan that weekend.

Easter is March 31st. To get the church ready for Holy Week, the Joyful Hosannas Easter hymn sing on Saturday, March 23, & Easter, we're holding a work day on Saturday, March 16 from 9 a.m. - noon.

I"m consulting with past trustee's leaders on what projects that we need to do.

There will be coffee & pastries in the morning and possibly lunch after.

The final item for this article is the 2024 budget.

At the February leadership meeting we adopted the 2024 budget of \$209,144, which works to almost \$17,500 per month. The total budget is an increase of \$2000 over the 2023 budget. Personnel costs make up almost 70% of our budget; building maintenance & utilities are 18%; the conference tithe is 10%, leaving 2+% for worship, office expenses, and education.

Increased costs/inflation are hitting each of us personally & in the business operation of Aldersgate.

The next leadership meeting is Sunday, March 17 at 11:30 after worship. Everyone is welcome to come to the leadership meeting. The first 10 minutes are set aside for your comments.

Hopefully you can see why Aldersgate needs you. The budget presents a challenge to us, and the anniversary celebration is an opportunity for us. Each one of you, each one of us are integral to our church family. It's only with all of us will Aldersgate survive the challenges, continue building relationships with each other, & provide opportunities to those who are looking for hope - the hope that comes through Jesus.

Financial Report

With the closing of the financial books for 2023, the General Fund started off 2024 with an operating balance of \$13,622.57. In addition, the church once again paid 100% of its tithes back to the Conference totaling \$19,601.65.

To meet the cash flow reserve necessary to ensure that the church's bills and obligations are paid on time, our emergency savings account at the Interfaith Credit Union was cashed out in January 2024 and those monies, totally \$11,738.09, moved to the General Fund (not included in the General Fund balance listed above). Total contributions to the General Fund from monthly giving for the month of January were only \$9,134.76. With expenses for January totaling \$17,760.95, a portion of our recently cashed out emergency savings had to be used to cover some of the shortfall. January ended with a General Fund reserve balance of \$20,081.52.

At the February 18th Leadership meeting, a new 2024 budget was adopted with a General Fund operating budget of \$209,144: up \$2,000 from the 2023 budget.

We continue to thank you for your prayers over the finances of the church and for all the little (and big) things you do to keep this church running smoothly.

However, they continue to accept the lap robes and turn them over to a Shriner (and former Worshipful Master of Table Mountain Lodge in Paradise) who is in constant contact with elementary school teachers, both up on The Ridge as well as in Sacramento, and my lap robes go to children "in need". Some of these young children sleep on a concrete floor for lack of a bed, etc. If you have any yarn you would like to get rid of, I would appreciate it if you would send it my way and know that it will be used for children in need. Before I started this, I had no idea there were children who were in such need, and I've been assured the lap robes bring not only warmth but joy to these children and makes my project even more worthwhile.
